STORYTIMES

Mother Goose on the Loose Storytime Ages 0 – 2+

Mondays & Thursdays at 10:30 AM

Winter/spring session begins January 23

Mother Goose on the Loose is an early literacy program that uses rhymes and songs to help pre-reading children get ready for reading. It incorporates music, movement, ritual, repetition, positive reinforcement, developmental tips, nursery rhymes, puppets, musical instruments, colored scarves, and book reading into a fun-filled 30 minute session for infants to 2-year-olds and caregivers.

Storytime for 2's & 3's ~ Ages 2 & 3 Wednesdays at 10:30 AM

Winter/spring session begins January 22

This 20 to 30 minute storytime includes songs and fingerplays, simple stories, feltboard stories, and phonemic awareness activities appropriate for children aged 2 & 3 years old and their caregivers (older siblings are also welcome). Our phonemic awareness activities will focus on learning and practicing the short vowel sounds and then some consonant sounds, and learning to put sounds together to make simple words.

Registration is required for the winter/spring session. Enrollment is limited to 10 children and their caregivers. Register here.

Art & Stories for 4's & 5's Ages 4 & 5 and up Mondays at 1:30 PM

Winter/spring session begins January 27

This 30 to 45 minute program, appropriate for children ages 4 to 7, begins with a few longer picturebook stories and phonemic awareness activities, then ends with a process art project that encourages preschoolers to explore art materials in an open-ended, creative manner.

Make sure to wear clothes that can get messy!
Our phonemic awareness activities will focus on
learning and practicing the short vowel sounds and then
some consonant sounds, and learning to put sounds
together to make simple words.

Registration is required for the winter/spring session.

Limit of 12 (minimum of 6) children.
